## SECURING OUR FUTURE CAMPAIGN BEGINS

At our December meeting, Church Council approved a bid of \$55,300 from Heartland Roofing to replace the flat roof portion of our building. This decision allows us to fine tune our campaign efforts to raise the much needed funding and move forward.

Based on the facts that we must allow a margin for material cost increases along with a need to build a cushion for our Capital Improvements and General Fund and future mission projects, we have set a campaign goal of \$108,000. This represents a need to raise \$36,000 per year over the life of our campaign in the next three years. In **February's** issue of Peace Notes you will find a **Campaign Commitment Form.** If yours is missing additional copies will be available in the narthex of the church. We are asking that you indicate your commitment choice and return this form to the church no later than **Sunday February 19**<sup>th</sup>.

This will allow us an opportunity to organize a confidential accounting procedure and allow time for any late returns before our campaign officially starts.

Using one-hundred (100) shingles as our unit of measurement allowed us to offer a number of options of contribution levels which we hope will meet everyone's comfort zone in supporting our needs. Special envelopes will be provided for your contributions and will be available in the narthex to be distributed according to your needs by a Stewardship Committee representative. The campaign will officially start on Sunday March 4th, at which time you can present your first contribution. We fully appreciate the fact that all of us face financial challenges due to the present poor economy which is why we are encouraging everyone to support our campaign and their church as generously as possible without creating additional burdens on themselves or their families.

If you have any questions, please contact Pastor Bill or John Haldeman, Stewardship Committee chairperson. Our church family has always been supportive and generous in the church's time of need and I am confident our campaign will be successful as we work together to **SECURE OUR FUTURE.** On behalf of the Stewardship Committee we thank you in advance for your generous support.

A campaign update presentation will be given to the congregation on Sunday January 29<sup>th</sup>. An opportunity to ask questions or express concerns will be provided at that time.
