In an attempt to get some new ideas for a Thanksgiving message I entered the word Thanksgiving into my search engine. Here are a couple of ideas it came up with:

1. A Thanksgiving cake. Start with cooking ground turkey into two large round layers. Set the first on a cookie sheet. "Ice" with mashed potatoes. 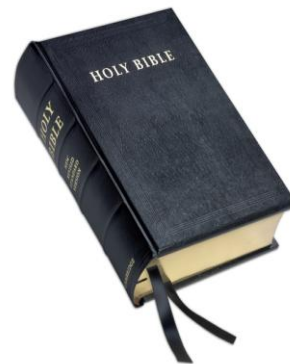

### LIBRARY IN ZAMBIA



At our last Spiritual Exploration Event, Courtney and Gretchen Hall informed us of a project to provide a library at the teacher training center in Zambia. They are looking for donations of anything that can be used in a library – desks, chairs, bookshelves, etc. They will be getting a shipping container which will be filled with donations and when it gets to Zambia the shipping container will have doors windows cut into it and it will be used as the actual library building. The cost of the shipping container is approximately \$10,000 plus shipping. Mid-November is the deadline for physical items that will go in the shipping container.

The church will be donating some of our extra children's chairs and 2 boxes of school supplies that have been in storage and unused for years. If you have anything that can be used in this setting and would like to donate those items, please contact the church office. Items need to be gathered and delivered by mid November. We are also planning a fundraising project so that our members can participate in raising the money needed for the container and shipping. Please look for additional information in the near future so that we can help provide for a Library in Zambia.

### MISSION MOMENT

When, in the scriptures, Jesus talks about money or wealth. What He is doing is encouraging us to think about our relationship with money and consider what it is that money can give us or do for us and what it cannot give or do.

Money cannot buy you faith. It can, in fact, buy a false sense of security that asks why do we need faith; or worse says – I don't need faith. But please understand this – the church is an oasis in the desert; the church is a port in the storm; the church is place of comfort and solace for those who are afraid and

alone; the church is a place where people can come to be fed, to be clothed, to be housed and more to be loved. As a community we need the church because the church is the place people turn to in their moments of need and if the church – Peace Church – is not there, where will the people turn? We can provide food, shelter, and clothing for our neighbors in need, but to do this we need a presence, a place from which to work. That place is our church building.

October 14, 2014**

Excused: Nancy Reese, Janice Kohl, Amy Miller and Ben Kegerise.

President John Haldeman brought the council meeting of Peace United Church of Christ to order on Tuesday, October 14, 2014. Pastor Bill started the meeting off with devotions and prayer.

**Review of last month's minutes** – Cindy Anthony made a motion to accept the minutes as presented and Jill Kegerise seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**Treasurer's Report** – Expenses were higher than income in September by \$9520. Mike Madara requests that all Weaver's receipts be given to him as soon as possible after purchases have been charged to the account. Weaver's does not send an invoice until there is a 60 day past due bill. When he gets receipts from Weaver's he sends them a check for that amount right away without receiving an invoice. There are currently over \$180 in receipts outstanding from Weavers and Mike doesn't know what accounts to charge them to.

\$500 will be paid towards the Benevolence loan which will reduce the balance to \$1500.

Mike presented the 2015 budget and Council discussed it. Vaye Freeman made a motion to accept the 2015 budget to be presented to the congregation and Bobbie Porter-Kunkel seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Jill Kegerise made a motion to accept the treasurer's report as presented and Pat Hall seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The post light outside main entrance was fixed.

Committees that need help setting up for events should contact John Haldeman and work crew can help set up for those events.

This week work crew will inspect and clean heater filters and get the thermostats ready for heating season.

There is a small leak in hallway that's related to the leak in the flat roof that was fixed a month ago. The contractor that installed flat roof will come back and look at it.

One of the fellowship hall's fans is broken and the work crew will fix that.

Thanks to Mary Bernstel who cleaned all the toys in the nursery.

John will talk with Guy Fultz to discuss a plan for plowing the lot this winter.

John is getting bids to trim the pine trees along the property line, including the spruce tree in the middle of the driveways and tree at the right hand corner of the Sanctuary wall. John has a bid from Bob Plank for \$1300, and one from Tomlinson Bomberger for \$1584. Pat Wolf made a motion to accept the \$1300 bid and Cindy Anthony seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**Pastor's Report** - Lydia and Reid Little will be baptized on October 26<sup>th</sup> and Cole Thomas Bailey will be baptized on November 16<sup>th</sup>.

November 2<sup>nd</sup> is Totenfest, the Congregational Dinner will be held on November 9<sup>th</sup>.

Thanksgiving Eve Service will be held November 26<sup>th</sup> at 7 pm at St Paul's Lutheran in Adamstown with one of the pastors from Muddy Creek speaking. November 30<sup>th</sup> is the first Sunday in Advent and December 7<sup>th</sup> is Hanging of the Greens. There is a Benevolence meeting on December 1<sup>st</sup>.

The EC Church in Adamstown will be joining the current 5 churches for the community Lenten services.

**Budget and Finance Report** – Did not meet.

**Benevolence Committee Report** – No report. Next meeting is December 1<sup>st</sup>.

**Stewardship Committee Report** – Did not meet. John Haldeman will be resigning as chairperson at the end of the year but would still like to be part of the committee. He would also like to track the Capital Campaign until it is completed.

**Adult Ministry Report** – Did not meet. The Apple Cookoff is on October 26<sup>th</sup>. Adult Ministry will be providing food for the craft show on November 22<sup>nd</sup>.

**Health and Welfare Report** – Health and Welfare will be making Thanksgiving baskets for those in need and fruit baskets for our special care and concern members. They will also be bagging Christmas cookies at hanging of the greens for the SCC members. If you know anybody in need of a Thanksgiving basket, let the Health and Welfare committee members know.

**Outreach Report** - Did not meet. Fellowship hours will be held in October, November and January through May.

**Altar Guild Report** - Peace Pantry for October was non-perishable food items for the Health and Welfare Thanksgiving baskets. Peace Pantry for November will be gifts for the Colonial Lodge Christmas party. \$483 was collected for Harvest Home. Poinsettia sales will be held on November 30<sup>th</sup>, December 7<sup>th</sup>, and December 14<sup>th</sup> and will be placed in the church on December 20<sup>th</sup>.
